

Summit Exhibit: Photovoice

- Around the main conference room you will see photos from the Photovoice projects.
- Photovoice is a participatory method that asks people with experience of a particular issue to tell their stories through photos. One exhibit focuses on the experiences of poor access to maternity care in the North Country, the second on DCYF engagement by women struggling from substance use disorder. Both exhibits are being used to advocate for improved perinatal care and support services in New Hampshire.

Summit Exhibit: Mom Hub Café

In the main hallway you can find our Mom Hub Café, a space to meet Heather Martin and Alison Palmer and learn about Mom Hub resources.

The NH Mom Hub connects pregnant and postpartum individuals, families, and providers to mental health support, peer navigation, and local resources through warm, compassionate care coordination. We aim to prevent moms from falling through the cracks.

Glossary: Coproduction

Coproduction – is "the joint activity of a service user and professional(s) in supporting and generating better health" done through mutual respect in partnership, where power and decision-making are shared, with open and honest communication, and that notices and invites each participant's unique strengths and expertise.

Glossary: Culture of Caring

The culture of caring involves both patients who receive care and a workforce who provide care. With a culture of caring, patients feel heard and respected and receive care that is effective, safe and person-centered, and staff feel valued and supported.



Glossary: Inclusion

Inclusion is about engaging and partnering with others, and creating a safe, positive, and nurturing environment where everyone feels welcome, respected and valued.



Glossary: Health Equity

As defined by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, **health equity** is achieved when every person has the opportunity to attain their full health potential, and no one is disadvantaged for achieving this potential because of social position or other socially determined circumstances."



Glossary: integrated collaborative approach

An **integrated collaborative approach** is the creation of a collaborative partnership that goes beyond traditional silos, promoting teamwork and communication between patients, family members, health care professionals from various disciplines, therapists and community health professionals all working together to deliver the best possible patient care.
